Planning for Reopening – Update</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> District Repopulation Planning Framework 	<p>Chancellor Neault Lynn reviewed the Planning Framework for Returning to Campus.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Jeff Waller is currently slated to teach on campus this summer. He is concerned there is nothing up on website for students saying guidelines and procedures are being developed. Students are concerned about safety procedures for upcoming in-person classes, and he does not know what to tell them. Information for students will be ready to go out on Monday after Cabinet discussion. Jim Mahler was not aware there are in-person classes happening this summer. He wants to know more about masking requirements, distancing requirements, etc. There needs to be more discussion about these guidelines. The Chancellor noted that masking and spacing will be required of all. No shared food will be allowed. Marsha Gable noted classroom size and spacing elements have been considered for in-person classes.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Alicia Munoz noted that when the schedule at Cuyamaca was developed, it was understood summer would be largely remote, similar to spring. • Jeff Waller was hesitant to teach in person, but was confident safety logistics had all been worked out. Now it seems all the details have not been worked out, and he is concerned. • The Chancellor noted that all in-person interaction is subject to CDC and other safety guidelines. • Kathleen Flynn and Jim Mahler noted that several items in the framework need to be negotiated. • The Chancellor asked Tim Corcoran to consult with CSEA, AFT and AA regarding impacts of returning to campus. • Marsha Gable will follow up with Marshall Fulbright on the schedule and address concerns. Some faculty have been requesting to teach in person.

There are multiple different opinions on the issue. A regional approach is desirable. <p>Sahar Abushaban reviewed the Facilities and Campus Safety Team Report:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Grossmont chillers are not down. • The recommendations of SC Engineering will be acted upon. • The 3-foot social distance standard only applies to K-12, not higher education. • Stimulus funds will be used to pay for most of the recommended items in the SC Engineering report. <p>Jessica Robinson and Alicia Munoz reviewed the Student Services Team Report:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There were no questions or comments. <p>Alicia Munoz reviewed the Instruction Team Report:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stimulus funds can be used to pay for impacts to classes, including smaller than normal sections on campus to accommodate distancing.
