Site Sustainability Updates</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Grossmont College -Status of Student Club Cuyamaca College -Environment Program District Services – Nicole Conklin/Ken Emmons Gafcon Prop V Construction Projects 	<p><u>Status of GC Student Club:</u> -Andrew Cable/GC Student Rep for Sustainability Committee and President of the GC Sustainability Student Club has transferred to SDSU majoring in Sustainability. Since his absence, the GC Sustainability Student Club has dissolved. In addition, there has not been a replacement for his position on the Sustainability Committee. <u>Grossmont College/Loren Holmquist:</u> -HVAC Systems – In the process of replacing. It would be 1.2m – 1.5m to replace all new and would have to go to DSA. Now looking into the option of working with companies that would reuse shell, which would cost \$400k - \$500k. Public Bid w/Gafcon (Schedule Maintenance Funds)</p>

	<p>-Add EMS (Automotive Logic) to Bldg. 53. & Bldg. 55. -Solar Tubes in Classrooms – Looking to put them on controls, since classes do not know that they are there and are not using them.</p> <p><u>Cuyamaca College/Bruce Farnham:</u> -New Median Project almost complete. Just needs a little more rocks added and bollards are being installed for security measures. Otay Water needs to finish marking the easement. (Send Pics to Anne Krueger when project is completed.) -Central Plant Job Walk yesterday. This will feed to the PE Bldg. instead of running both the 500 ton and 50 ton to feed energy to this building. Completion of project will be end of August 2018.</p> <p><u>District Services/Nicole Conklin & Ken Emmons:</u> -EV Stations mentioned above. -Bike to Work Day (i-commute) coming in May. Will be big this year with lots of give-a-ways. -Looking into a Drop-off area for Staff/Students that use Uber, Lift, etc. Companies will give CAPS signs to use for location.</p> <p><u>Gafcon Prop V Construction Projects/Fred Parker:</u> -Theater Project had a sustainability savings w/ the dirt that was transferred over to the Soccer Field. 20 feet of dirt was dugout for the orchestra pit on the GC Theater Project. By sifting out the rocks for the campus to reuse and turning the dirt into clean dirt made a \$150k savings in the project.</p>
