1. Guests and Introductions	Tania Jabour introduced herself and decided to join the taskforce to share valuable information from her student conduct, racial equity and social justice taskforce. There may be some overlap in discussions and combining information may be useful to the group.
2. Discussion of California CC District Research	Nicole shared with the group a spreadsheet containing information regarding police models at other California Community College Districts. Several members of the taskforce offered to help make calls to investigate different models. The overall finding was that there is no one particular model available for

	community colleges. Overwhelmingly, it was suggested that a campus wide survey be conducted with students and staff to gauge recommendations, needs and desires for security and law enforcement. The taskforce agreed at the last meeting that a survey would be conducted to get a baseline for pertinent information and follow up open forums will follow. Many of the Captains, Commanders andIt was noted that many departments contacted were not available or chose not to participate in the discussion.Chancellor Neault again explained to the taskforce that the goal is to make an immediate recommendation for the 2021-2022 fiscal year. When Julio discussed mental health and social worker support again she explained that mission may be too large for this tractforme and the two when the
	taskforce and that we phase the discussions to make our recommendations more timely. Social justice issues may take longer to alleviate than the taskforce has to make their recommendations before 2022-2023.
3. Open Forum Discussion	There was support for open forums. The student leaders offered to reach out to student clubs on campus and ask them to participate in further or separate discussion. Tania also offered support for combing forums and invited the team to her current discussions.
Next Steps	Nicole to set up dates for focus groups in late February. Will send "Save the dates" to group and set up a pre- forum meeting. In addition, Nicole will check with Brianna for survey results which will take place from December 7-18 <sup>th</sup> .
